## **Nagaland Board and NSE Academy to impart financial literacy to students**

From 2017 session, the Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has made a course on financial literacy compulsory for class IX students, in all higher secondary schools under the NBSE. Called 'Concepts of Financial Literacy', the course has been designed by the NSE Academy. It'll help familiarise students about basics of finance. NSE Academy will also train the teachers, who will teach the course in NBSE-registered schools. For 2017, teachers from 167 schools have been trained at NBSE's office in Kohima, the capital of Nagaland. Over 15,000 students are expected to enrol. The curriculum comprises of 25 periods of 45 minutes each.
